It is our great pleasure to invite you to the 8th Congress of the Central European Association of Germanists (MGV), jointly organized by the Association and the Faculty of Teacher Education, University of Zagreb, to be held in Zagreb from September 17 to 19, 2026.

The overarching theme – "Digital Epochal Shifts in Language, Culture, and Literature: Challenges for German Studies" – offers a broad framework for reflecting on the disruptions and transformations currently affecting language, literature, culture, and didactics in today's digital and societal landscape.

Inspired by Wilhelm von Humboldt's assertion that "language is the formative organ of thought," the congress will focus on five thematic areas.

English as a Lingua Franca of the Digital Era: Evolving Language, Literature, Culture, and Teaching Practices

Within the framework of the main conference theme, which focuses on digital transformations in the German language, literature, and culture, this section is dedicated to exploring and discussing the impact of the digital era on the English language, literature, and culture, with a particular emphasis on teaching and learning English. The section will provide a platform for the exchange of ideas and research on how digital technologies are shaping the English language, literature, and culture, and how English Studies can adapt and evolve in response to these changes. Special attention will be given to teaching and learning English, including the exploration of innovative approaches, new trends, and pedagogical challenges arising from digital transformation. Participants are invited to submit their research and experiences related to the impact of the digital era on the English language, literature, and culture. Contributions may explore, but are not limited to, the following topics:

- *Digital Linguistics:* The influence of social networks, text messaging, and emojis on grammar, vocabulary, and intergenerational communication; the rise of internet slang, abbreviations (e.g., "LOL," "BRB"), and memetics.
- *Digital Literature and Narratives:* The development of hypertext, interactive stories, and AI-generated literature; the role of e-books, audiobooks, and blogs in transforming how literature is consumed and distributed.
- *Culture and Digital Media:* The impact of social media (e.g. YouTube, Instagram, TikTok, etc.) on cultural production, identity formation, and global cultural exchange.
- *Teaching and Learning English in the Digital Era:* The use of digital tools such as gamification, virtual reality, and chatbots in language education;

challenges and innovations in hybrid and online learning, assessment, and student motivation.

- *Digital Humanities and Interdisciplinary Approaches*: The application of digital tools such as corpus linguistics and digital archives in the study of English literature and culture; collaborations between English Studies and fields such as computer science, media studies, and cultural studies.

We are particularly delighted that colleagues from the field of English Studies will be joining this year's congress, thereby enriching and further deepening the interdisciplinary dialogue.

We warmly invite you to submit a proposal for a presentation within one of the outlined thematic areas.
